NEW BUSINESS


2022 Budget Approval: On a motion by Andrew Kroft, seconded by David Brown and unanimously carried, the Board approval the 2022 Department Budget.

Six of the municipalities experienced an increase in calls for police service in October 2021 compared to October 2020. Those municipalities are Dover, Franklin, Heidelberg, Manheim, Paradise Township as well as North York Borough. Five municipalities experienced a decrease in calls for police service in October 2021 compared to October 2020. Those municipalities are Conewago, Jackson, Manchester, and North Codorus Township as well as Dover Borough.

In the area of traffic law enforcement, the following occurred during the month of October 2021 when compared to the month of October 2020:

Traffic citations were up from 988 to 1005 +17
Warning cards/faulty equipment cards were up from 228 to 336 +108
Parking tickets were up from 5 to 7 +2

Proudly Serving:

Patrols conducted over 1,300 self-initiated traffic investigations during the month of October 2021. Not included in that figure are the 30 drivers arrested for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) of Drugs/Alcohol. The average BAC was .171 by volume, the lowest BAC being .022 and the highest BAC being .316 by volume.

The traffic accident summary reveals the following:

October 2020 there were 19 people injured October 2021 there were 23 people injured

October 2020 there were 14 injury accidents October 2021 there were 20 injury accidents

October 2020 there were a total of 171 accidents October 2021 there were a total of 200 accidents

During October 2021, Patrol and CID arrested 202 criminal defendants which is 11 less criminal arrests than October 2020. Of the 202 arrests, 34 were felonies, 95 were misdemeanors, and 73 were summary offenses.
