#### **NEW BUSINESS**



Six of the municipalities experienced an increase in calls for police service in June 2022 compared to June 2021. Those municipalities are Conewago, Dover, Franklin, North Codorus and Paradise Township as well as North York Borough. Three of the municipalities experienced a decrease in calls for police service in June 2022 compared to June 2021. Those municipalities are Heidelberg, Jackson, Manchester and Manheim Township. Dover Borough remained unchanged from June 2021 to June 2022.

In the area of traffic law enforcement, the following occurred during the month of June 2022 when compared to the month of June 2021:

Traffic citations were down from 1331 to 1276 Warning cards/faulty equipment cards were down from 360 to 266 -94 +32 Parking tickets were up from 11 to 43

**Proudly Serving:** 

Patrols conducted over 1,500 self-initiated traffic investigations during the month of June 2022. Not included in that figure are the 33 drivers arrested for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) of Drugs/Alcohol. The average BAC was .161 by volume, the lowest BAC being .088 and the highest BAC being .231 by volume.

The traffic accident summary reveals the following:

June 2021 there were 47 people injured June 2022 there were 35 people injured

June 2021 there were 31 injury accidents June 2022 there were 25 injury accidents

June 2021 there were a total of 161 accidents June 2022 there were a total of 161 accidents

During June 2022, Patrol and CID arrested 213 criminal defendants which is 10 more criminal arrests than June 2021. Of the 213 arrests, 26 were felonies, 124 were misdemeanors, and 63 were summary offenses.
