Seven of the municipalities experienced an increase in calls for police service in March 2023 compared to March 2022. Those municipalities are Conewago, Dover, Franklin, Heidelberg, Jackson, Manchester and Paradise Township. Four municipalities experienced a decrease in calls for police service in March 2023 compared to March 2022. Those municipalities are Manheim and North Codorus Township as well as Dover and North York Borough.

In the area of traffic law enforcement, the following occurred during the month of March 2023 when compared to the month of March 2022:

Traffic citations were up from 1067 to 1087 +20 Warning cards/faulty equipment cards were up from 321 to 365 ± 44 Parking tickets were down from 18 to 13

Proudly Serving:

Patrols conducted over 1,400 self-initiated traffic investigations during the month of March 2023. Not included in that figure are the 29 drivers arrested for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) of Drugs/Alcohol. The average BAC was .166 by volume, the lowest BAC being .011 and the highest BAC being .327 by volume.

The traffic accident summary reveals the following:

March 2022 there were 18 people injured March 2023 there were 13 people injured

March 2022 there were 12 injury accidents March 2023 there were 11 injury accidents

March 2022 there were a total of 145 accidents March 2023 there were a total of 165 accidents

During March 2023, Patrol and CID arrested 223 criminal defendants which is 40 more criminal arrests than March 2022. Of the 223 arrests, 31 were felonies, 108 were misdemeanors, and 84 were summary offenses.
