Eight of the municipalities experienced an increase in calls for police service in May 2023 compared to May 2022. Those municipalities are Conewago, Dover, Heidelberg, Jackson, Manchester, Manheim, and Paradise Township as well as Dover Borough. Three municipalities experienced a decrease in calls for police service in May 2023 compared to May 2022. Those municipalities are Franklin and North Codorus Township as well as North York Borough.

In the area of traffic law enforcement, the following occurred during the month of May 2023 when compared to the month of May 2022:

Traffic citations were up from 905 to 932 +27
Warning cards/faulty equipment cards were up from 282 to 33 +52
Parking tickets were down from 9 to 6 -3

Patrols conducted over 1,200 self-initiated traffic investigations during the month of May 2023. Not included in that figure are the 20 drivers arrested for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) of Drugs/Alcohol. The average BAC was .164 by volume, the lowest BAC being .089 and the highest BAC being .279 by volume.

The traffic accident summary reveals the following:

May 2022 there were 39 people injured
May 2023 there were 25 people injured

May 2022 there were 28 injury accidents
May 2023 there were 18 injury accidents

May 2022 there were a total of 169 accidents
May 2023 there were a total of 167 accidents

During May 2023, Patrol and CID arrested 242 criminal defendants which is 61 more criminal arrests than May 2022. Of the 242 arrests, 39 were felonies, 119 were misdemeanors, and 84 were summary offenses.
