
Permanent Appointment to Police Officer: Chief Lash recommended Alexandra Godfrey be permanently appointed to the rank of Patrol Officer effective August 26, 2023. On a motion by Rodney Brandstedter, second by David Brown and unanimously carried the recommendation was approved.

2022 Financial Statements: Chief Lash provided the Commissioners with a copy of the 2022 financial statement. He recommended a surplus of \$193,018.95 be moved from the General Operating Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund. On a motion from Rodney Brandstedter, second by Mark Wenrich and unanimously carried, the Board agreed to the transfer of funds.

Request for Proposal (RFP) Approval: On a motion by Nancy Brunk, second by Rodney Brandstedter and unanimously carried, the Commission voted to approve the award and negotiation of a contract between the Northern York County Regional Police Commission and Mission Critical Partners (MCP) to serve as a Cell Tower Consultant for an amount not to exceed \$193,148.00. The project is paid for by an awarded grant from the Department of Community and Economic Development.

Eight of the municipalities experienced an increase in calls for police service in July 2023 compared to July 2022. Those municipalities are Conewago, Dover, Heidelberg, Jackson, Manchester, and Paradise Twp as well as Dover and North York Borough. One municipality, Franklin Township had a decrease in calls for police service and two municipalities, Manheim and North Codorus Township remained unchanged.

In the area of traffic law enforcement, the following occurred during the month of July 2023 when compared to the month of July 2022:

Traffic citations were down from 1217 to 928 -289 Warning cards/faulty equipment cards were up from 335 to 313 Parking tickets were down from 11 to 1 -10

Proudly Serving:

Patrols conducted over 1,200 self-initiated traffic investigations during the month of July 2023. Not included in that figure are the 37 drivers arrested for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) of Drugs/Alcohol. The average BAC was .151 by volume, the lowest BAC being .080 and the highest BAC being .298 by volume.

The traffic accident summary reveals the following:

July 2022 there were 26 people injured July 2023 there were 41 people injured

July 2022 there were 21 injury accidents July 2023 there were 27 injury accidents

July 2022 there were a total of 130 accidents July 2023 there were a total of 150 accidents

During July 2023, Patrol and CID arrested 215 criminal defendants which is 5 more criminal arrests than July 2022. Of the 215 arrests, 19 were felonies, 107 were misdemeanors, and 89 were summary offenses.
