The Northern York County Regional Police Department (NYCRPD) was founded in 1972, becoming Pennsylvania's first regional police force. It was created to offer a more efficient and cohesive approach to law enforcement by pooling resources from multiple municipalities. This innovative approach allowed smaller communities to benefit from enhanced police services, increased coverage, and specialized units that would otherwise be out of reach. Over the years, additional municipalities joined the department, expanding its jurisdiction and reach.

Throughout its history, NYCRPD has remained dedicated to community-oriented policing, focusing on building strong relationships with residents and local businesses. As the department grew, it incorporated advanced training programs, state-of-the-art technology, and specialized units, to better serve the evolving needs of its communities. NYCRPD has become a model for regional policing, known for its commitment to safety, professionalism, and innovation in law enforcement.

OUR NEW POLICE OPERATIONS FACILITY

35,000 SOUARE FOOT OPERATIONS CENTER

The NYCRPD needs a new police operations facility to accommodate its current needs while also preparing for future growth. The existing facility is outdated and lacks the space and resources required by a modern police force. A new facility would incorporate state-of-the-art technology for enhanced communications, data management, and operational efficiency, ensuring officers are equipped to handle today's public safety demands.

The new building will provide expanded locker room spaces for both male and female officers, promoting inclusivity and supporting a growing team. It will also feature wellness and fitness areas, improving officer health, readiness, and overall job performance.

With future growth in mind, the facility is designed to accommodate additional personnel and evolving needs, ensuring it remains functional for years to come. It will include two classrooms for ongoing professional development and house the largest public safety training center in the Susquehanna Valley, positioning the NYCRPD as a regional hub for law enforcement training. This facility is key to the department's ability to continue serving the community efficiently and effectively, both now and in the future.


